**1:00pm** – Hawaiian Air scheduled arrival time in Honolulu


**2:20pm** – Alaska Air scheduled arrival time in Honolulu

## Day 2 – Sunday, April 6

**Queen's Surf Beach** is a popular bodysurfing, swimming, snorkeling, and surfing beach located in Waikiki's Kuhio Beach Park near the Honolulu Zoo, the Waikiki Aquarium, and Kapiolani Park. It was named after Queen Liliuokalani because at one time her beach house and its pier were located here. It can be identified by the pedestrian walkway jutting into the sea that is known as the Kapahulu Groin and the huge "Sunset on the Beach" outdoor movie screen frame on one end of the beach. Queen's Surf beach is inside Kuhio Beach Park.



## Day 5 – Wednesday, April 9

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**7:00am** – Enjoy buffet breakfast.

**7:45am** – Bus departs for **Pearl Harbor** and the **City of Honolulu** tour. While at Pearl Harbor you will visit the USS Arizona Memorial. On the Honolulu City tour you will see Iolani Palace (the only royal palace on US soil), the famous statue of King Kamehameha, the Capital Building, Chinatown and other places of historical interest in Honolulu.



Within the grounds of **Pearl Harbor** are a number of exhibits, displays, memorials, and museums, honoring not only the 1,177 victims of the Japanese attacks, but all of those who bravely served in World War II. Built over the wreckage of the USS Arizona, the Memorial is a sobering experience where visitors to Hawaii come to pay their respects.



Dinner at **Bubba Gump Shrimp Co.**, followed by shopping time at this world famous mall.




## Day 6 – Thursday, April 10

**8:00am** – Enjoy buffet breakfast.

Spend the morning your leisure – lunch on own.

**2:00pm** – Bus departs hotel for **Kamehameha Schools** and the final competitions (drum lines, winter guards, solo dance), dinner, exhibitions, awards ceremony and dance. Late return to hotel (approximate departure time from Kamehameha is 10:15pm).



**Kamehameha Schools** was founded by the will of Bernice Pauahi Bishop, a descendant of Hawaiian royalty, and the great-granddaughter of Kamehameha the Great. Hawaiian cultural values and practices as well as service learning are integral to Kamehameha Schools programs, both on campus and in the community. It is the policy of Kamehameha Schools to give preference to applicants of Hawaiian ancestry to the extent permitted by law. Kamehameha Schools is the largest private landowner in the state of Hawaii. Income generated from its residential, commercial and resort

leases, as well as diverse investments, fund the schools' maintenance and operations. The Schools' endowment has experienced dramatic growth over the past few years, resulting in the total portfolio value of \$9.06 billion as of June 30, 2011.

## Day 7 – Friday, April 11

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**TBA** – Bag pull. Please place all suitcases on the floor inside the door of your room. Anything you will take with you on the plane (carry-ons, backpacks, purses, etc.) should be placed on the bed. This will let the porters know not to take them.

**8:00am** – Check-out of the hotel. Please return keys and pay for any incidentals you may have. Report any damage to the front desk prior to departure.

**8:30am** – Buses depart for Honolulu Airport.

*When you arrive at the airport, you must claim your luggage and instruments for inspection by the US Agriculture Dept. Once your bags/instruments have cleared inspection you will proceed to the check-in counter to get your boarding passes. All bags must also be cleared by the US Transportation Security Administration prior to receiving your boarding passes.*

**\*\*\*NOTE:** Equipment used by the TSA is extremely powerful. Do not put film, exposed or unexposed in your checked suitcase. It should go in your carry-on bag\*

**11:50am** – Alaska Airline #892 scheduled to depart Honolulu. Arrival time in San Diego is 8:25pm.

**1:15pm** – Hawaiian Airlines #16 scheduled to depart Honolulu. Arrival time in San Diego is 8:35pm.
